

TASK ORGANIZATION: MCB FORTY (Herein known as the Battalion)

1. SITUATION. Peacetime deployment and employment of Naval Construction Battalions requires continuing rotation of units with emphasis on mobility and readiness. Accordingly, it is necessary to move the Battalion from CBC Davisville to the MARCORPBASE, CAMLEJ in June 1966, for military training under the following conditions:

a. Enemy forces. None

b. Friendly forces.

c. Attachment. Provisional Rifle/Weapons Company from MCB FIFTY-EIGHT.

2. MISSION. Pursuant to reference (a), the Battalion is to deploy to CAMLEJ, in conjunction with military training requirements, for the operational readiness of Naval Construction Battalions.

3. EXECUTION. When directed in June 1966, the Battalion will depart and deploy for a period of approximately four weeks. While in transit and during the training period, the Battalion will maintain readiness conditions required by its assigned contingency designation.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS:

a. Standard operational procedures, set forth by reference (b), will be followed.

b. Leave will be administered in accordance with reference (c).

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- c. Movement reports will be made in accordance with reference (d).
- d. Equipment assignments are made by Annex B.
- e. Total personnel to be deployed including the Attachment shall not exceed 685.
- f. Additional Administrative and Logistic information was provided by reference (e).

5. COMMAND AND SIGNAL:

- a. The Commanding Officer is hereby directed to report to the CG, MARCORPBASE, CAMLEJ in accordance with Art. 1324, U. S. Navy Regulations.
- b. Authority to deploy an Advance Party is granted.
- c. Direct liaison is authorized with the MARCORPBASE and component activities.

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
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ANNEX B
EQUIPMENT ASSIGNMENT

1. The USN Equipment authorized for this deployment is listed on the EAM Listing which will be forwarded under separate cover.
2. Reference (f) sets forth the requirements for control and management reporting of the equipment assigned.
3. The USN Equipment required for this training is located at Camp Lejeune in the custody of the Motor Transport Officer whose telephone number is 7-3134 or 7-5736. The equipment can be drawn from the Motor Transport Officer on Form DD 1150, signed by the Battalion C.O. or his representative. Upon completion of the training, the USN equipment will be returned to the Motor Transport Officer, again utilizing the Form DD 1150 which the Motor Transport Officer will sign as accepting custody of the equipment.
4. During the training deployment and while the equipment is being utilized by the Battalion, the Battalion will be responsible for all maintenance and minor repair required and maintain the equipment in E-1 condition. Funds required for procurement of repair parts will be provided by the CBLANT Logistics Officer.
5. Equipment requiring major repairs will be turned in to the Motor Transport Officer who will effect such repairs as may be necessary.
6. In accordance with reference (f), the 512 report on all USN Equipment will be completed and forwarded to CBLANT Code 41 within five (5) days after the return of the Battalion to CBC Davisville.

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ANNEX C
PUBLIC AFFAIRS

1. MISSION. Collect and disseminate public affairs material that will illustrate the defensive, military posture and smartness of today's Seabees.

2. EXECUTION:

a. The release of public affairs material in connection with this deployment shall be in accordance with references (a) and (b).

b. Extreme care must be exercised to ensure that public affairs releases conform with the following:

(1) Do not make reference to any aspect of the deployment which may be considered classified.

(2) Do not contain any material which may reflect with discredit on the United States or any branch of the U. S. Armed Forces.

(3) Do not contain any material which tends to degrade or ridicule the customs or living conditions of the area where deployed.

c. News releases will be made only through the operational/area commander.

d. A copy of each release will be forwarded to this Headquarters.
